The Problem

Millions of American workers suffer from workplace bullying, an issue ripe for addressing in the 21st Century. Severe psychiatric injuries have been directly linked to workplace bullying, especially when others gang up on the victim or condone the actions of the perpetrators by their silence. Employers also suffer negative consequences such as reduced productivity of its employees and increased medical and turnover costs.

Coming Together to Build Solutions

On Friday, April 4, 2014, NJ State Senator Linda Greenstein, sponsor of the proposed Senate Healthy Workplace Act, and the National Workplace Bullying Coalition (NWBC) will hold the first of several conventions in an effort to bring together representatives of employers, employees, industry and non-profit groups, unions, legal community, workplace consultants, academic experts, organizational psychologists, community groups and targets of abuse to consider ways to address and prevent bullying in the workplace. This convention will gather information specific to New Jersey with the goal to ultimately seek a national solution. Topics include:

- What are the present best practices for policies and training in use by public and private employers? What else can be done and how do we share this information?
- What is lacking in existing laws to adequately protect individuals from workplace bullying?
- Discussion of the NJ [Healthy Workplace Act S3115](#) with Senator Linda Greenstein.
